CRCC Ethics Webinar: Presenter Biographies

Vilia Tarvydas, Ph.D., LHMC, CRC, Director of I-DARE **Lead Presenter - Public, Private, and General Sessions**

Vilia is a Professor in the Department of Counseling, Rehabilitation, and Student Development at The University of Iowa where she is also Director of the Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Ethics (I-DARE). Among her many honors and awards are: 1999 Eda Holt Lifetime Rehabilitation Achievement Award of the Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification; 2001 University of Iowa Collegiate Teacher of the Year; 2008 Distinguished Career in Rehabilitation Education Award of the National Council on Rehabilitation Education (NCRE), and; James F. Garrett Distinguished Career Research Award from the American Rehabilitation Counseling Association (ARCA). Vilia has served as President of the National Council on Rehabilitation Education (2003-04), President of the American Rehabilitation Counseling Association (1997-98), Co-Chair of the Alliance for Rehabilitation Counseling, and is a founding member of the Rehabilitation Counseling Consortium.

Vilia has an extensive background in ethics governance and leadership. She chaired the Iowa Board of Behavioral Science Examiner's Disciplinary Committee for 8 years until summer 2008 and was a member of the ACA Taskforce on Revision of the Code of Ethics that produced the 2005 The ACA Code of Ethics. She chaired groups that developed the 1987 unified Code of Ethics for Professional Rehabilitation Counselors and the Scope of Practice for Rehabilitation Counseling. She also served as the CRCC Commissioner on the CRCC Taskforce that drafted the 2002 CRCC Code of Professional Ethics and most recently, was the Chair of the CRCC Code Revision Taskforce that produced the 2010 CRCC Code of Professional Ethics.

Vilia is published extensively in the areas of ethics, ethical decision-making, and professional governance and standards. Her most recent textbook, *Counseling Ethics and Decision Making* (2007) is a 3rd edition of her earlier book, *Ethical and Professional Issues in Counseling*. She is also the senior Co-Editor of a special joint edition of three professional journals in rehabilitation counseling - *Journal of Applied Rehabilitation Counseling*, *Rehabilitation Counseling Bulletin*, and *Rehab Pro* - which will be published in Summer 2010 to provide scholarly discussion of the new CRCC Code of Professional Ethics.

Mary Barros-Bailey, Ph.D., CRC, CDMS, CLCP, NCC, D/ABVE **Co-Presenter, Private Sector Sessions**

Mary is in private practice as a bilingual rehabilitation counselor, vocational expert, and life care planner in Boise, Idaho. She was the 2007-08 Chair of the Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification (CRCC) and served on the CRCC's Ethics, Exam & Research, and Standards Committees. She was also a member of the CRCC Code Revision Taskforce that prepared and produced the 2010 Code of Professional Ethics for Rehabilitation Counselors. Mary's research focus has been in areas of professional issues/ethics, multicultural and aging issues in rehabilitation counseling, forensic practice, and mixed research. She serves as a reviewer and is on various editorial boards for peer review publications involving counseling, rehabilitation, and mixed research.

Kathe F. Matrone, Ph.D., CRC **Co-Presenter, Public Sector Sessions**

Kathe is the Director of the Center for Continuing Education in Rehabilitation (CCER) at the University of Washington Department of Rehabilitation Medicine. She also serves as the Technical Assistance Director for the Technical Assistance and Continuing Education (TACE) Center and the Principal Investigator for the Disability Business Technical Assistance Center (DBTAC) for Region 10. With over 30 years experience in the field of rehabilitation and a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC) since 1975, Kathe has expertise in disability policy development, program evaluation, and clinical case practice. She is also actively involved in advocacy efforts focusing on developing systems of service delivery and preparation of qualified staff.

Jodi L. Saunders, Ph.D., CRC **Co-Presenter, General Sessions**

Jodi is an Associate Professor and Program Coordinator of The Graduate Programs in Rehabilitation at The University of Iowa. Her many awards and honors include: The University of Iowa College of Education Teaching Award; The American Rehabilitation Counseling Association (ARCA) research award; The National Council on Rehabilitation Education (NCRE) New Educator Director of the Year award; a Mary Witzer Scholar, and; National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) grant recipient. Jodi was also a past Chair of the Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification (CRCC), past member of the CRCC Ethics Committee, and member of the CRCC Code Revision Taskforce for both the 2002 and 2010 Codes.

For PC-based attendees

Required: Windows® 2000, XP Home, XP Pro, 2003 Server, Vista

For Macintosh®-based attendees

Required: Mac OS® X 10.4 (Tiger®) or newer

Q: Is there a registration deadline?

A: Yes. Your completed form and payment must be postmarked at least 15 days prior to the selected Webinar session.

Q: How do I pay for the Webinar?

A: After you complete the online registration information, you will be redirected to a new page that takes you to the CRCC Webinar Payment Form. This page should load in approx. 10 seconds. If it does not load, please click on the "new page" link to access the CRCC Webinar Payment Form. You must complete the entire form, print the form, and mail it to CRCC (address is on the form) with your payment. Acceptable forms of payment are check or money order and credit card - MasterCard, VISA, or American Express. Purchase orders are not accepted.

Q: Can I register for more than one session?

A: Yes, you may register for as many sessions as you would like. However, CRCs and CCRCs will only receive 2-clock hours of pre-approved Continuing Education (CE) for the first completed session. Additional CE hours will not be awarded for additional Webinar sessions completed.

Q: Can I register a group of people?

A: Yes, you may. To ensure all participants in your group receive CE credit for attending the Webinar, you must register as follows:
